CURRENT STATE OF MODERN SOCIETY: REGIONAL CONFLICTS AND THE GLOBAL ORDER

Dear colleagues,

The Serbian Sociological Society, the Faculty of Security Studies of the University of Belgrade and the Institute for Political Studies from Belgrade are organizing an international scientific conference with the topic *Current State of Modern Society: Regional Conflicts and the Global Order*.

Our world has changed. Although we may not be completely sure how and in what direction, and we do not have a generally accepted explanation of the processes taking place before our eyes, all of us feel these changes. The world order – broadly understood as a pattern of structural relations between countries – established after the Second World War and further strengthened in Cold War, has been thoroughly changed. It has been questioned by the transition of power, the weakening of state sovereignty and the loss of trust in the existing – national and international – and their legitimacy. This is most clearly seen in the increasing number of regional conflicts worldwide. From the Caucasus and East Europe, via the Middle East and West Africa, to the Indo-Pacific, there are rampant intolerances, conflicts and open clashes not seen since the Second World War. Although these processes have been referred to as globalization, and these states as the global order, we cannot still be certain that we have partly perceived the consequences of such changes. That is why the aim of the conference about **regional conflicts and the global order** is to deepen our understanding of the world that is more and more intensively changing before our eyes.

Within the permanent topic of the conference of the Serbian Sociological Society about the **current state in modern society**, it is also possible to apply announcements about other social problems and sociological research you are involved in currently. Applications are sent in the same manner as announcements with the topic of regional conflicts and the global order.
